For Davis, whose favorite stories to write are those with strong leads that her own daughters can admire and relate to, the inspiration for *KONA* was born from a need to offer children and parents struggling with cancer a glimmer of hope.

"We each have our reasons for writing this book. For me, I wanted something that resonated with kids," says Davis. "While *Kona* is a fictional retelling, I was inspired by several children who are still dealing with childhood cancer themselves. Their strengths and determination are endless—inspiring and uplifting in so many ways. And while we see these kids as fighters, we often don't give light to the struggles and emotions they carry with them every day of their lives. The story of *Kona* offers that and so much more."

Shortly after her publishing debut, Melissa welcomed her first child, setting in motion the delicate balancing act of her adult life—


